This notice contained two deadlines: A January 20 to verbally report emissions to local and state authorities, and a requirement to follow up the verbal notification within 30 days with a written report. People that should attend include: CAFO farms, those near CAFO size, CCAs, livestock consultants, local LEPC staff.
